Joining a walk

Walks are open to anyone, including visitors on holiday. Newcomers are especially welcome; those who walk regularly with us will be invited to become a member. It is at the discretion of the Leader to refuse to take anyone considered to be unsuitably equipped or likely to cause a problem during the walk.

Walkers must wear suitable footwear and clothing, carry enough food and drink and a small First Aid pack. In case of accident, ID and contact numbers should be carried. Walk leaders can usually provide ID cards for this purpose. While the safety of members is always of paramount concern, accidents may occasionally occur. It is important to appreciate that you have a responsibility for the safety of yourself and fellow walkers.

Dogs are **NOT** allowed in the lambing season (1st Dec. - 30th April). At other times dogs <u>on short leads</u> are permitted if indicated in the walk description.

Meeting for the walk

The start point of a walk is sometimes given in the programme in addition to the meeting point. In exceptional circumstances, such as adverse weather conditions, the leader might need to cancel the walk. **The leader will only inform those present at the meeting point.** Anyone wishing to travel directly to the start point is advised to contact the leader to confirm if the walk will go ahead.

Walks are graded as follows:-

Easy: Generally 6 miles or less using good footpaths with no major inclines or obstacles. Suitable for new or infrequent walkers.

Moderate: 6 to 12 miles long across coastal, farmland and forested areas with occasional ascents, stiles and obstacles. Suitable for regular walkers with a reasonable level of fitness.

Strenuous: Generally greater than 12 miles across upland, moorland and rugged countryside with several steep climbs and obstacles. Suitable only for regular, experienced walkers with a good level of fitness and stamina.

Programme Updates

This programme is put together several months in advance. Inevitably there will be some changes over the six months. Please check before the walk either on the Swansea Ramblers website or by calling the walk leader.

It will be easy-paced in order to see the sights. There will also be a walk on the East range where there are not the same security restrictions

Walk Descriptions

- A linear 7 mile walk from Stack Rocks to Brownslade needing a short car shuttle service for the return journey.
- b) A linear walk of 5 miles to follow on from option (a). This will be on the East range from Stack Rocks to Boshertson village via St Govans church, Broadhaven and the Lily Ponds. A car shuttle service will provide the return journey. Anybody who wishes has the choice of walking back to Stack Rocks, a distance of a further 4 miles. This may not be escorted as a total of 16 miles will depend on the health of the leader!

We can expect to see nesting sea birds at Stack Rocks, very rare beetles (therefore hard to find), choughs, hill forts, a mock up Afghan village, a flooded mill and Brownslade model farm visited by Edward VII, his wife and mistress whom we have been told is a distant relative of Camilla P-B. During gales spectacular seas can be seen.

The area has been preserved since 1938 and is unique.

The forms will be issued at Crosshands for completion en route. A security briefing will be given. No dogs are permitted.
